## RESILIENT FLOORING

### A Guide to Comparing Chemical and Material Criteria of Product Certifications and Eco-Labels

This guide will enable purchasers to compare criteria of the most chemically rigorous multi-attribute eco-labels for resilient flooring in the U.S., so they may choose which best aligns with their organizational needs.

Multi-attribute eco-labels include numerous requirements within one host certification, reducing purchaser burden as they seek to understand the full environmental story of a product. We did not evaluate the rigor and methodology of how product compliance is determined among these eco-labels.

This guide does not include any manufacturer or industry-created eco-claims or labels nor does it address environmental factors outside of toxics such as water usage, recyclability, and manufacturer take back requirements.

Many multi-attribute eco-label systems for resilient flooring do not address fair or safe labor and manufacturing practices nor issues related to a product's carbon footprint. We therefore could not compare their performance in these areas.

The chemicals and materials in the comparison criteria are those known to be used, or could potentially be used, in the manufacturing of resilient flooring and known to be toxic to human and environmental health.

<b>INSTALLATION</b>							
The adhesive used to install the flooring must be certified as meeting California 01350 (California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Standard Method v1.2-2017), GREENGUARD Gold, SCS Indoor Advantage Gold, FloorScore, Blue Angel for Low-Emission Floor Covering Adhesives, or Cradle to Cradle Gold or Platinum; or the flooring must be attached mechanically without a chemical adhesive. If a wet adhesive is used, it also must meet South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) Rule 1168 (2005)	✓	✓					✓
<b>WOOD FINISHING</b>							
Wood flooring must be pre-finished	✓	✓

Does not require the periodic use of strippers, sealants, or floor finishes to maintain the product	✓	✓

We did not include NSF/ANSI 332 for resilient flooring because it is a point-based system that awards points across a variety of criteria, possibly resulting in a product earning the certification without addressing chemicals of concern.
